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General Information

Am I Eligible

All registered International Students admitted to a degree program holding a F-1 or J-1 Visa taking at least 1 credit, and all registered non-degree seeking International Students, Scholars, Visiting Faculty, and Exchange High School Students engaged in full-time non-degree course of study, research, teaching or other University approved program and entering the U.S. on DS-2019 and J-1 Visa, are eligible and will be automatically enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plan and the premium will be added to the Student's tuition bill, unless evidence of UW System approved health insurance coverage is filed with the campus on or before the waiver deadline.

All registered International Students who have been granted Optional Practical Training (OPT) on F-1 Visa and International Students on a University approved Medical Leave of Absence (MLOA) are eligible to enroll on a voluntary basis.

Dependents

Insured Students who are enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plan may also enroll their eligible Dependents (who are not U.S. citizens) on a J-2 or F-2 Visa status.
